BIOGRAPHY

Jaime Motta is a seasoned sports journalist with more than two decades of experience in Spanish and English-language sports broadcasting and continues as one the most well-known sports personalities in the Hispanic market.

Most recently, Motta was the Los Angeles bureau correspondent for the Univision Sports Network. Prior to that he was the Los Angeles Bureau correspondent for ESPN Deportes. Motta has covered major events including:

- World Series, Super Bowls and the Final Four.
- ESPN's bilingual boxing reporter, covering major fights.
- ESPN Deportes' reporter for the United States Men's National Soccer Team during the World Cup in Germany 2006 and the Women's World Cup for both ESPN and ESPN Deportes in 2007.
- Sideline reporter for ESPN Deportes international soccer matches.

Before joining ESPN, Motta co-hosted the Los Angeles based sports show, Galaxy Deportivo and was the color commentator for the MLS Los Angeles Galaxy for KWHY-TV. He was also a sports anchor at KWHY from 2001-03, as well as the main anchor for Mundo Deportivo, a half-hour sports show on Saturdays and Sundays.

An avid boxing fan, Motta has called many championship fights including, Pacquiao-Marquez IV, Sergio Martinez vs. Julio Cesar Chavez Jr., and the matchup between the late Diego Corrales and Jose Luis Castillo.

Motta began his professional career as a sports producer in 1990 for Univision's Spanish language KDTV-TV in San Francisco. In 1996, Motta was brought to Los Angeles to become one of the sports anchors at Univision's flagship, KMEX-TV.

A native of Guatemala, Motta graduated from the University of Miami with a bachelor of science Degree in Broadcast Journalism and Psychology. While at UM, he was the play-by-play announcer and color man for the football, baseball and basketball programs.

Motta is broadcast-ready in English and Spanish, and has lived in Argentina, Panama, Venezuela and Brazil. Motta currently resides with his wife and children in Los Angeles, California.
