BIO and PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

Emmy award-winning broadcaster Brian Webber is one of the nation's most versatile sportscasters.

Webber joined Pac-12 Networks in 2013 as a play-by-play announcer for Pac-12 Networks, calling a full range of sports from basketball to gymnastics. In addition, Webber is also part of the broadcast team at Tennis Channel, serving as a play-by-play announcer and host from the network's inception in 2003.

He is also a regular substitute host for "The Jim Rome Show" simulcast on CBS Sports Radio and CBS Sports Network and serves as a guest host for nationally syndicated "The Rich Eisen Show."

From 2015-19, Webber hosted "NFL First & Goal" on TuneIn featuring seven hours of commercial-free NFL Red Zone radio. In addition, Webber co-hosted "NFL No Huddle, a weekday NFL talk show on TuneIn. He was a key contributor to NBC Sports Radio hosting "The Brian Webber Show" heard nationally on weekends from 2013-2018.

In 2012-2013, Webber co- hosted "NFLAM," the NFL Network's signature four-hour live daily morning show. He also served as lead host of Fox Sports' digital video content from 2006-2012 anchoring studio coverage of the NFL, MLB, and NASCAR, as well as hosting on-site at marquee events such as the Super Bowl and the Final Four.

Webber began his broadcasting career at Fox Sports Net Bay Area in San Francisco holding a myriad of positions including lead anchor of pre- and post-game coverage of the local MLB, NHL, and NBA teams, and anchor/reporter of the nightly "Bay Area Sports Report." In addition, Webber served as sideline reporter for the NBA's Golden State Warriors and on-site intermission host for the NHL's San Jose Sharks

Webber's play-by-play assignments include national broadcast work for Fox Sports Net, ESPNU, and CBS Sports Network. He has also worked as a sideline reporter for "The NFL on Fox" and anchor of DirecTV's MLB "Strike Zone Channel." He served as a co-host for "Fox Sports Gameday," a national weekend show on Fox Sports Radio from 2007-2009.

Webber graduated with distinction from Stanford University, majoring in Political Science, and holds a Masters of Business Administration from the University of Southern California.
